
We chose the slogan "Connecting" for our Stewardship Campaign 21/22 to express our commitment to reach out to newcomers, to the young and the elderly, to the introverts and the social butterflies. Let's come back stronger!

To design new innovative programs and to allow participation members and friends in-person and online we need

financial resources. We need to:

 Finance our fantastic staff members, who act as champions & cheerleaders for our ideas/programs.

- **2.** Pay for our operations such as buildings, grounds and office
- Contribute to the Unitarian Universalist Association: "Live our values aloud, not alone."



We are fortunate that we have some rental income, but the heavy load has to be carried by members and friends through pledges and gifts.

At UUCC we stress that giving should happen in many forms: time, talent AND treasure. Therefore we created the attached **Pledge Card**, and we encourage you to take a few extra minutes to share with us how you would like to spend your **time** at UUCC, which **talents** you could contribute, and how much of your "**treasure**" you could contribute financially. This stewardship campaign is an intentional two-way road. Please let us know what's important to you and how we can build connections, so that you can find and nurture beloved communities at UUCC.

We have set the following **financial goals** for our stewardship campaign this year:

1. Increase the number of pledging households by more than 10% >> 75 households

2. Raise average pledges by 5% >> \$160,000

In 2020/21, 65 households of UUCC pledged \$142,000. In past years we were fortunate to have higher amounts of total pledges. Pledging is a noble habit that takes courage and a strong vision. Please consider that the average pledge in 2020/21 was \$ 2,185 and that 17% of our households contributed 50% of our pledges. Pledges of any amounts will be appreciated and celebrated.

One easy way to give is through automatic deduction from your checking account (see option on pledge card). Your pledges will be treated confidentially and we will inform throughout the year about the status of received pledges.



Once again, we have a fun way to report on the progress of our stewardship campaign. The "Pizza Garden" on our church grounds will be revitalized for that purpose with colorful flowers & plants and act like a pie chart. Watch the progress at our upcoming Sunday services.
