#### Decision Items:

- Topic: GA Delegates - Mandy

We can appoint delegates to GA, without paying registration fee, if they are to just vote on elections. They aren't able to vote on business items, or attend workshops if not paying registrants.

- Motion: John moved to accept Daidee Springer and Andy Foskey as delegates to the UUA General Assembly 2022.
- Second: Rodger seconded.

Unanimously approved.

#### Information/Planning:

- Membership Roll. Gather Monique Lewis, Wendy Sapp, and Nicky Ozbek and three board members to review the list. New Bylaws need to be reviewed before removing names. New bylaws have different language on who can remain/called a member.
   Process includes a communication to the member before removing them.
- Annual Meeting Planning Debrief.

We need to to actually have members check in at the beginning of the meeting. Perhaps checkin as they arrive at church and get a card to hold up to vote. Also have a board member on line to be part of a chat if needed.

John felt safe...with most masked folks.

Christian: Be more transparent of the budget. Review main points of what increased/decreased, etc. Rodger: Get the budget out earlier and encourage feedback prior to the meeting. Mandy reminded board they've been elected to decide how to govern, and what info needs to be shared.

Sally: Verbalize the actual vote counts, i.e. XX yes, XX no, XX abstain

Mandy: Stewardship needs a budget to run the stewardship campaign.

Sally: When announcing the meeting date next year, emphasize why it's important and not seem like an inconvenience to take the time to take it.

John: Concerned about the increasing budget, and shrinking membership. Rodger: Remember we'll be reviewing the budget again in October (three months into the fiscal year).

## Board year Debrief

Chen: Timelines slipped away from us. Start planning for year early in year, especially for Stewardship Campaign. Christian: Recommends by December, board has target for goals ready for 2023. The campaign needs to come before the budget review. Judy: Set these discussed goals at the board retreat. John offered his backyard again for the retreat.

John: Board commends Chen formally for doing a remarkable double term!!!! Mandy: Chen kept us focus on vision, vs. tragedy during COVID, etc. His work has included two years as president, one year as incoming president, and prior, on the minister search committee.

Farin: Church needs to see the working board more. Be more of the greeters, etc. Get connected with visitors.

Judy: Decide how the sunday board reps are going to be done; wear some sort of visible ribbon to identify as board members. Suggestion from Chen: Do this at board retreat.

Christian: Kudos to Farin. We need, as a church, to plan events three months in advance.

Camille: Shared one of the new member families were excited to be part of the annual meeting, and be able to because we had nursery care! Mandy invited visitors to view the annual meeting who cheered about not supporting Church of God because of living our values.

Chen: Need more of these stories: human connection.

Judy: Bring back quarterly council meetings. Set the dates for the entire year.

John: Board meetings don't have to last 2 hours.

- Email swaps for officers June 30/July 1 needs to happen. Farin can reset. Update profile pictures and email signatures.

- Follow up Items

Christian: Reminders on Attendance records need to be done each Sunday! Need a form provided by Farin to board reps to fill out. Will help us stay on top of issues that may have arose if attendance drops; also keep Beloved Cafe when it comes back in fall. Mandy: Watching the door is extremely important. It needs to be locked when service starts.

Amy: Safety Committee existed at one time. Let's have one! Christine Hunt expressed interest in being on it. Let's get a schedule of volunteers NOW to watch the door. Have the list near the coffee list as well. John: Look into a security guard?

John: We need to know what our functioning committees are; who is on them. Staff will create the initial list.

 Nominating Committee needs for 2022-23 Judy will send out emails to each person to ask. New Bylaws could change board structure as well, though board could choose the structure.

#### CONGREGATIONAL LIFE ACTIVITIES

#### 70th Anniversary UUCC

- Wowzer Sunday Service with sermon by Charles White McGehee on June 5<sup>th</sup> was very well received. Longtime members expressed their gratitude and talk about their memories of from the 1970s/80s.
- ➤ 1950s Cooking/Dinner Event with 50s Costumes or Fashion Show tentatively planned for September 2022 >> Christian will reach out to Gale Audier and Jen Horning to finalize the date
- Nicky Ozbek and Judy Gallagaher are working on the UUCC history project with good progress.

#### 1st and 3rd Wednesday Coffee

Gathering has been well established with about 10 – 15 participant under leadership of Selina Duncan. Last two gatherings focused on gun legislation.

#### Summer Adult Education Series ("Environmental Justice in Chattanooga")

- The May Wednesday Coffee gatherings sparked a forum style series with external speakers on 7 Sundays in July and August (for details see nUUsletter).
- Selina Duncan proposed to use 2021/2022 Adult Education budget for WUTC advertising and pay external speakers and no objections have been raised. She will reach out to Steve Hollingsworth this week to get the WUTC advertising scheduled.
- She also initiated plant and vegetable sales twice so far to support for the expenses of the summer adult education series and has raised almost \$300 so far.

#### ATTENDANCE

## Sunday Worship (6/5 through 6/19- 4 Sundays, no attendance record for 5/29)

- Total Attendance dropped to 63 in June (84 in May).
  - In Person Attendance: 48 Adults (56) and 2 children (12 big drop)
  - Online Attendance: 13 (16)
- Attendance Tracking.
  - Repeated lack of attendance record. Board members should be given attendance form and reminded to regularly record the attendance each Sunday.
  - Attendance of beloved café should be captured regularly, as several church members only attend once per Sunday
  - Remember prior attendance: 77 adults + 20 children in 2019, 86 adults + 24 children in 2016
